How did OPERA consider responding?

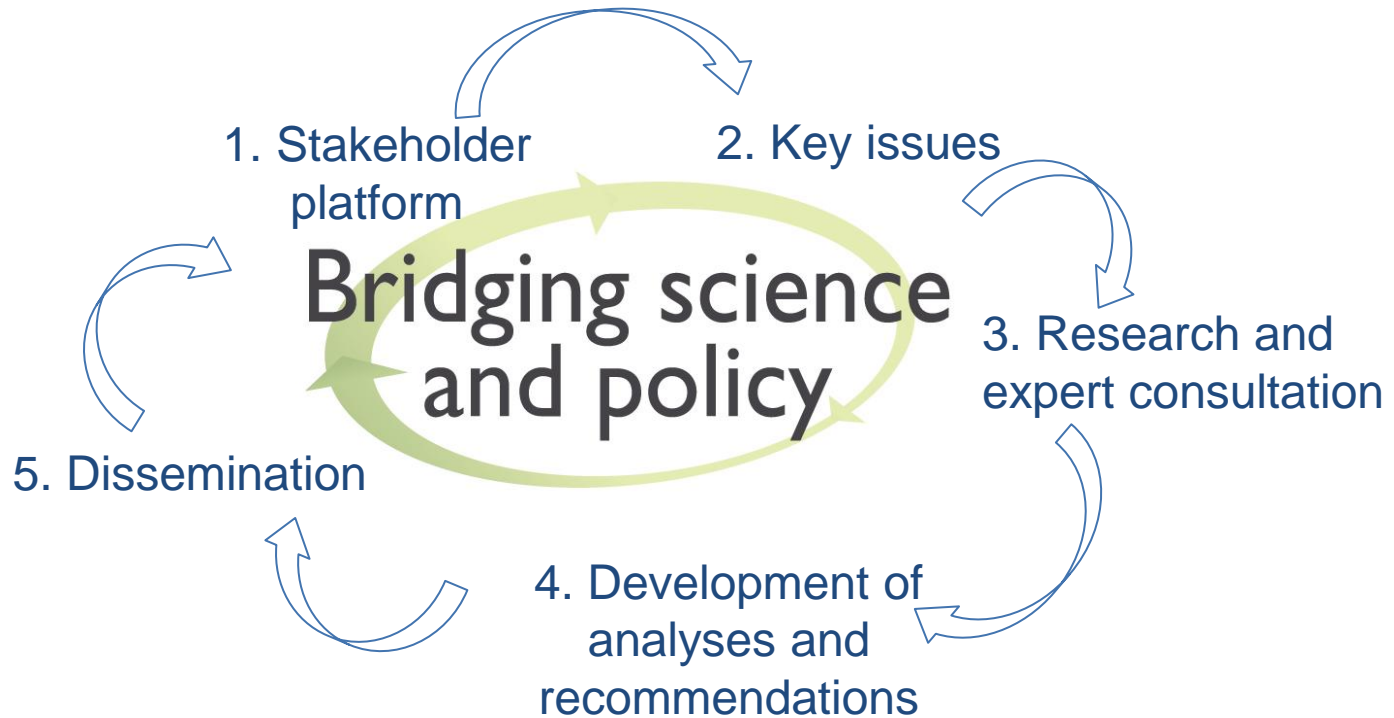

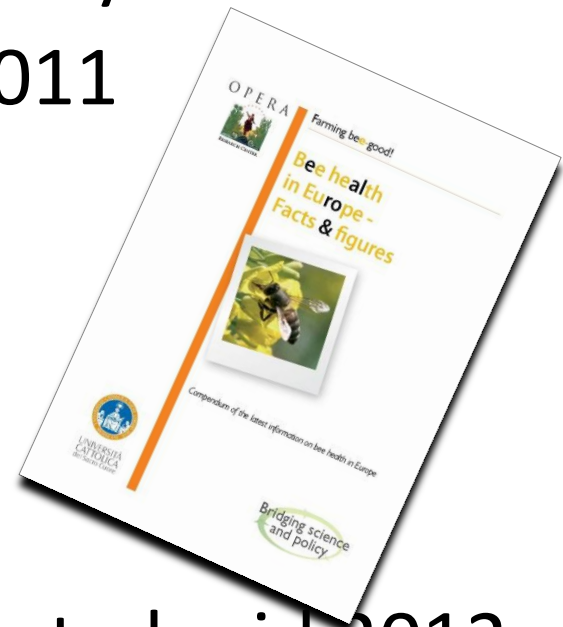

- Activity developed in the context of the involvement in the issue of ecosystem services
- Working group set up since 2011
- First report published in autumn 2011
- Update for the new report started mid 2012

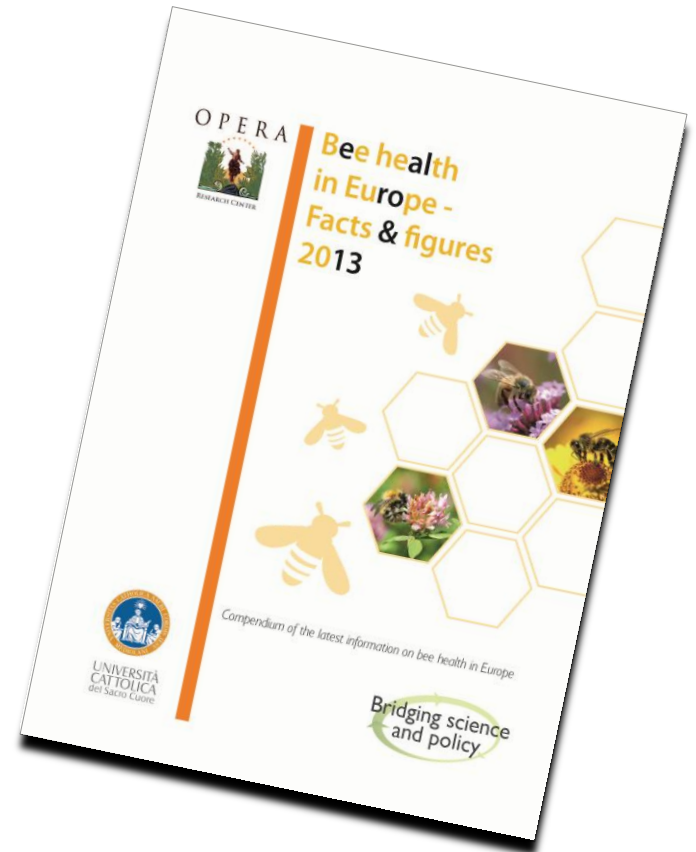

Objectives of the WG

- build on the findings of the previous OPERA report, published in 2011,
- to include state-of-the-art information and research results on the issue of honeybees in agricultural systems
- collect in one single comprehensive document relevant data on bee health

Bee health workshops

- Multi-stakeholder process to debate on bee health in Europe
- Extract conclusions and recommendations for policy makers at national and EU level.
- Planned debates: Berlin, Warsaw, London, Madrid, Paris, Rome, Budapest, Brussels
- Relevant recommendations for :
 - CAP reform
 - Biodiversity policy
 - Apiculture national Programs
 - Regulatory activities
